Short Bio:

Dr. Ioannis Pantazopoulos is an assistant professor of Emergency Medicine at the University of Thessaly. He is also adjunct assistant professor of Emergency Medicine at the University of Bern in Switzerland and adjunct associate professor of Respiratory and Emergency Medicine at the European University of Cyprus in Nicosia. He is both a Pulmonary Medicine and Intensive Care Specialist with two Master of Science degrees from the Medical school of the University of Athens, covering Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation and Thoracic Oncology. He has also received his Ph.D. from the same medical school where he studied the use of impedance threshold device in asphyxial cardiac arrest. He has completed two fellowship programs one in “Pain, Agitation and Delirium” at the University of Brescia, Medical School, Spedali Civili Hospital in Italy and one in “ARDS” at the University of Paris, Medical School, Pitie Salpetriere Hospital in France. His extensive field of expertise includes the European Diploma in Adult Respiratory Medicine, his participation as an active instructor in four Master of Science courses of the University of Athens and Thessaly in Emergency Medicine and Intensive Care, as well as a director in Life Support courses and in Panhellenic Conferences coordinating the organizing committee. An avid researcher he co-authored various book chapters, has published dozens of research papers in international medical journals and conferences, having been awarded ten times for his work to this day. Additionally, he is a peer reviewer in thirteen medical journals and a member of the editorial board of two journals.
