Short Bio:

I am Professor of Applied Entomology at the University of Thessaly, Greece since 2004. I received my PhD in Entomology from the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, and I then pursued post-doctoral training at the University of California Davis (2001 – 2003). Receiving a scholarship from OECD, I worked at the University of California as visiting scholar in 2011. I have supervised 10 PhD., 24 Master's and more than 50 undergraduate theses. I am part of the editorial board (subject or associate editor) of several journals (e.g. Journal of Economic Entomology, Physiological Entomology, Frontiers in Ecology and Evolution, PlosOne, Insects, Agronomy) and of the council of the International Organization for Biological Control (IOBC). I served as (a) consultant for the International Atomic Energy Agency, the Japanese organization NICOOD, the European Union, the European Food Safety Authority, and the International Olive Council and (b) in several national and international panels evaluating grant applications and scientists' promotions. My group has awarded many competitive grants funded from the European Union, the International Atomic Energy Agency, the National Institute of Health (USA) and I served as the coordinator of the Horizon 2020 project FF-IPM. My published work includes more than 150 peer reviewed papers in insect biology, demography, management, public health and aging.
