Short Bio:

Matthaios Speletas was born in 1966 in Edessa (Greece) and graduated from the Medical School of Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (Greece) in 1990. In 1999, he completed the specialty of hematology and his PhD studies at the Democritus University of Thrace (Alexandroupolis, Greece). In 1997, he was trained in the fields of Molecular Biology and Flow Cytometry at the University of Umea (Sweden). He worked as a postdoctoral fellow at the Immunology Department of University of Lund (Sweden, 1999-2000), and as a consultant in Papageorgiou General Hospital of Thessaloniki (2000-2007). He was also trained in the fields of cytogenetics and molecular cytogenetics as a visitor scientist, at the Institute Gustave-Roussy (Paris, 2004). From 2007 is a member of the Academic society of the Faculty of Medicine in the University of Thessaly – Larissa, Greece (as Assistant Professor 2007-2013, as Associate Professor 2013-2017, as Professor of Medical Immunology 2018 until now). His research mainly focuses on the study of primary antibody immunodeficiencies, hereditary angioedema and inflammation. He published more than 100 manuscripts (<https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pubmed/?term=speletas>) in international peer-review journals, and he has written several chapters in scientific books. He is also a member of several regional and international scientific societies.
